Local Area Information


Tyddyn Heilyn Caravan Park is an immaculate, small, quiet, sheltered family run park. The famous "LON GOED" goes through the farmland here. The LON GOED is a 6 mile stretch of oak and elm lined roofed wide footpath that goes through magnificent countryside ideal for walkers and wildlife lovers alike and has some lovely scenery to be seen from it of Snowdon one end and on the other end looks down on Harlech castle and the beautiful coastline. Tyddyn Heilyn is very central whichever direction one wants to go- be it sea or mountains- nowhere is far from here. Llanystumdwy, the birthplace and Museum and burial place of David Lloyd George (the Earl of Dwyfor and Prime Minister) is only down the road from here (approx 5mins by car). Tyddyn Heilyn is near the edge of the Snowdonia National Park yet near the nice beaches.

Pwllheli is the unofficial capital of The Llyn Peninsula, in Northwest Wales. Much of The Llyn Peninsula is an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, and Pwllheli is an ideal base to explore this area, as well as nearby Snowdonia, Anglesey and the western coast of Wales.

Also in the town centre you will find many shops, selling everything you need. The town is full of seaside character.

The impressive new marina is now one of the best in Wales, with 24 hour access and all the services boaters need. The marina berths over 400 boats and there is space for visitors to moor up overnight. The marina has brought many more boaters to Pwllheli and helped other aspects of tourism in the area.

Pwllheli has two beaches. South Beach, which is mainly shingle, has been awarded the Blue Flag Award for clean sands and waters. South Beach stretches from Gimble Rock, across the promenade, and around towards Llanbedrog.
